A great slogan under which we claim our right to live our lives openly and express our gender freely. But also to denounce the physical violence exercised on us, from the so-called conversion "therapies" to the forced sterilisation of trans and intersex people.

This is a slogan that also reminds us that many of us, all over the world, are still living with anti-LGBTQI phobias every day. Our bodies are our lives, and we have the right to live free and with dignity!

Aggression, violence, censorship, repression... These are words that we all experience far too often..

Aggressions - even in its simplest forms, a disgusted look or a slur yelled out of a car window must be eliminated.

Violence - is unacceptable and must be punished to the fullest extent of the law. **Justice must ensure that our rights are respected and protected.**







Censorship and **repression** - exercised by any government on our way of life has been changing and must continue to change.

Education for Equality is the basis on which we will build a better society for all. Thanks for the struggle of those that came before us and those that continue to fight for our freedoms today. It is because of them that we see with hope that our identity and our rights are becoming more and more visible.

We are helped by the "pink points" that are set during festivals as points of presence, as points of respect and, unfortunately, as points of refuge and help in case of aggression.

Refugees come in many different forms: Refugees of War, Refugees of Injustices, Refugees of Inequality and, LGBTIQ+ Refugees. While the roads Refugees travel might be very different, the "destination" is the same; to find a better life. This day and every day, as an LGBTIQ+ community, we must be aware of the road we have travelled, of the injustices we have fought, and of the rights we have won to be standing here today.

As Refugees ourselves, we should be obligated and committed, to all those who have had to leave their countries, their homes, their culture, fleeing repression, lack of freedoms, and those who have not yet had the freedom to know their bodies, their lives, their rights.

This is why it is essential to be people of solidarity and always help those in need, wherever they are from or whatever may be the reason for their flight, because there are no second class citizens.

Phobia in any form: Homophobia, biphobia, transphobia, lesbophobia are discriminatory and exclusionary attitudes, based on prejudices.

Phobias and Prejudices are built on stereotypes, on stereotypical models and behaviors and must be eliminated.

When seeking to eliminate Phobias and Prejudices, we need to look at ourselves and be careful not to perpetuate these Phobias and Prejudices onto others unintentionally.







We, too, are not free from prejudice and we can only redeem ourselves by helping others, by saving those drowning on our shores, by holding hands and shouting loudly.
